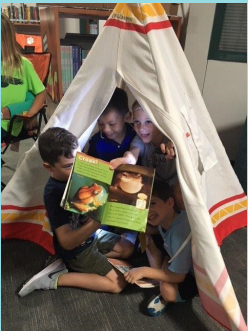
1st Grade Liveschool Quarterly Rewards

Healthy Sleep Habits: How Many Hours Does Your Child Need?

Recommended Amount of Sleep for Pediatric Populations*

Age	Recommended Sleep Hours per 24 Hour Period
Infants: 4 to 12 months	12 to 16 hours (including naps)
Toddlers: 1 to 2 years	11 to 14 hours (including naps)
Preschoolers: 3 to 5 years	10 to 13 hours (including naps)
Gradeschoolers: 6 to 12 years	9 to 12 hours
Teens: 13 to 18 years	8 to 10 hours

Do those numbers surprise you?

So, are you sending your child off to bed early enough? If those numbers are surprising to you, you're not alone. Working and single parents, especially, are often forced to get by on 5, 6, or even fewer hours of sleep each night. This is likely impacting your own social and mental functioning, as well as increasing your risk for other health problems. It might be tempting to think that your children can also get by with less sleep than they need, or that they should be able to cope fairly well with a few skipped hours here and there. However, all children thrive on a regular bedtime routine. Regular sleep deprivation often leads to some pretty difficult behaviors and health problems—irritability, difficulty concentrating, hypertension, obesity, headaches, and depression. Children who get enough sleep have a healthier immune system, and better school performance, behavior, memory, and mental health.

As we near the end of the school year, I would like to remind you that your child's medication needs to be picked up from the clinic by **MAY 24th, 2018**. School policy does not allow for medication to remain in the school over the summer. It will be important for you to make arrangements to pick up your child's medication since medications may not go home with the student. Any medication left in the clinic after **MAY 24th, 2018** will be discarded according to district policy.

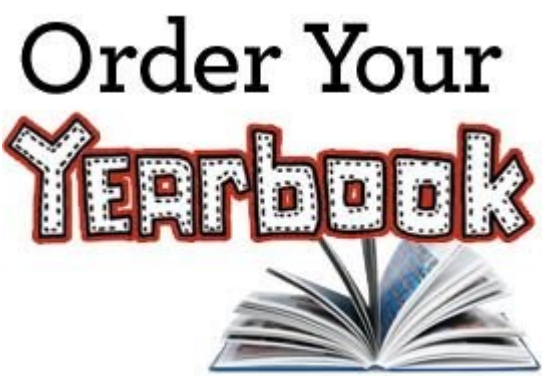


GIRLS ON THE RUN

(And, if applicable, a Homeowners Acknowledgement Form & Affidavit of Residency Form)

2.) Any Utility Bill dated within 30 days:

3.) You must also provide ONE of the following documents dated within 30 days:

Property Tax Record, Telephone/Cell phone Statement, Homeowners/Renters Insurance Documents, Bank Statement/Paycheck Stub, Vehicle Registration, Credit Card Statement, Medical Insurance Statement—all showing the new address.
