

What is SAC?

The Valley Ridge Academy School Advisory Council (SAC) is a collaborative group that supports the development and implementation of educational goals and objectives, enhances the School Improvement Plan, and promotes cooperation between the community and the school.

What does a SAC member do?

Attends at least 8 meetings per year.

Participate regularly in SAC meetings and carry out assignments.

Act as a communication link between the SAC, the community, and the school.

Provide suggestions and recommendations representative of the views of parents, citizens, and community organizations.

What is a Funds Request?

Funds requests should be aligned with the School Improvement Plan and must be reviewed by the SAC. Members can submit requests during SAC meetings, where they will be discussed and evaluated based on their alignment with educational goals and objectives.

How often does SAC meet?

The SAC meets at least eight times per year, with the first meeting held before the end of September or October of the current school year. Meetings are scheduled to accommodate parents, students, teachers, education support personnel, and community members.

Who can be a member of SAC?

The SAC includes parents and guardians of students, community representatives, the school principal, teaching staff members, and non-teaching staff members. Members who are not district employees form the majority of the SAC.
