Exams

As you know, we are now in the assessment window for state assessments in English language arts and math, 8th grade science, and End-of-Course exams which count 30% of the student's final course grade (7th grade civics, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Biology and U.S. History). For courses that do not have a state assessment, district final exams will be given during the last ten days of school and those will be 10% of the second semester grade for middle and high school students. How can a student prepare? Of course, teachers will be the first source and guide for students.

In addition, the Secondary Instructional Services Department has Year-at-a-Glance resources for language arts, math, science, social studies and world languages, grades 6–12. 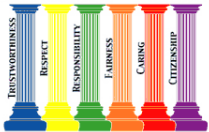

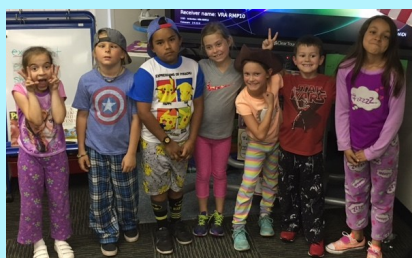

Lowe's Toolbox for Education Grant for VRA Learning Garden & Natural Playground

In early April, the VRA playground got a few welcome additions, courtesy of Lowe's Home Improvement, dozens of volunteers, and the PTO. Due to the high cost of a single piece of commercial playground equipment, it takes years to fully populate an area with play items for our students. Thanks to the generosity of Lowe's and parent volunteers, we were able to construct five fun items for the young children's playground, as well as a citrus learning garden, in one weekend!



Over the course of the last two years, parent volunteers, Amy Zobel and Kim Piety, worked closely with the administration to produce a winning grant proposal to Lowe's Toolbox for Education. The amount awarded was \$4,900 out of possible maximum award of \$5,000.

The proposal was to utilize materials from Lowe's to build large-scale musical instruments and a boat for imaginative play – the S.S. Hawk! Another major aspect of the proposal was the creation of a citrus learning garden surrounding picnic tables. The vision is for classes to be held out there, for students to care for the trees, learn about the process of fruiting and pollination, and harvest the citrus. Social activities such as class parties can also be held at the tables.




Upon receiving the grant, the writers, along with Mrs. Hudson and Hector Rodriguez of Florida Home Remodeling Group designed and planned each item for the project and organized the volunteer weekend that brought it to life.

Many amazingly talented and energetic parents came out to volunteer their time to build the items for the Pre-K/Kindergarten playground and to plant citrus trees and build the tables for the learning garden. The PTO provided much-needed sustenance throughout the day, in the form of food and drinks. Lowe's employee, Andy Macy, helped immensely by working with the team to plan, order and deliver the materials, and volunteered for twelve hours at VRA working alongside the parents and providing expert guidance.

Registration, Residency, & Immunization Requirements

Early Kindergarten Registration Dates

Monday May 15th from 9:00-1:00

Drop ins only – No appointments taken

Registration packets must be completed prior to coming to the open registrations. Registering kindergartners must have the required shots*** and a physical dated August 11, 2016 or after. Lease or rental agreements will not be accepted if they are expiring prior to August 10, 2017.

Rising kindergartners with birthdays falling after preregistration dates will need to register during the summer after they have received their updated physicals and immunizations. Summer registration dates and times will be posted once the current school year has ended.

***Four or five doses of DTaP,
Four or five doses of IPV
Two doses of MMR
Three doses of Hep B
Two doses of Varicella

Attention All 6th Graders!!

The Tdap immunization shot is required for all 7th graders and must be recorded on a Florida 680 form. As soon as your student receives this shot, the form can be brought to the front office, faxed (904-547-4095) or emailed (to paige.lange@stjohns.k12.fl.us) even if the student is still in 6th grade. **Per district policy, all 7th grade students that do not have this shot will not be allowed to start school on August 10, 2017.** Please contact Paige Lange, Registrar at 904-547-4096 with any questions.



Address Change Requirements

In order to update your child's record, SJCS now requires you to complete a "Student Change of Address Form". Along with the completed and signed form, you must submit the following:

Mortgage Statement/Property Deed/Settlement Statement/Closing Documents

OR

Lease/Rental Agreement with names of occupants

(And, if applicable, a Homeowners Acknowledgement Form & Affidavit of Residency Form)

You must also provide TWO of the following documents:

Utility Bill, Property Tax Record, Telephone/Cell phone Statement, Homeowners/Renters Insurance Documents, Bank Statement/Paycheck Stub, Vehicle Registration, Credit Card Statement, Medical Insurance Statement—all showing the new address.

In addition, you must show a valid photo ID/drivers license.
