
Your involvement in the Read-a-thon will help your child develop a lasting love of reading.

The Kinder Garden

Acknowledgements and thanks to Mrs. Davis for letting us maintain the school garden this year. Thanks to Mr. Vega and Mr. Wilson for filling up our rain barrel, and Mrs. Kicsak for entrusting me to guide her class in this fabulous learning experience. We have tied the learning to science, community skills and social studies and even been able to use our produce in cooking! Thanks to all the paraprofessionals and students that have participated in working in the garden.



The Kinder Garden

We have been spending many weeks working on our school garden. The work includes wearing gloves and using garden tools like the trowels, shovels, and rakes in preparing the raised beds, weeding, watering, composting, planting, harvesting, pruning, digging, and raking. All our plants have not succeeded – the potatoes were left in their pots too long before planting and did not establish.

Our first crops were cauliflower and broccoli. Did you know that broccoli produce pretty, yellow flowers? We picked some and decorated the fence one day. We used the broccoli to create a broccoli cheddar casserole — which we all tasted. Amazing to have students grow a vegetable and then use it in a dish! Next, we were able to begin harvesting kale and Swiss chard. Many students chose to take one of these to eat at home. Both can be included in a salad or cooked. It's a great way to be healthy and eat your (very fresh) greens! I have been eating a lot more veggies!





The Kinder Garden

We are waiting for our Brussel sprouts to mature and actually sprout- hopefully only a few more weeks. We are also waiting for the recently planted varieties of lettuce, tomatoes, eggplant, yellow peppers, strawberries, and sugar snap peas to grow and develop their flowers and then produce fruit.

In the meantime, we have several herbs growing in the taller raised beds. These include parsley, chives, oregano, rosemary, and peppermint. We all like to take a fresh peppermint leaf and eat it. It is refreshing and a natural mouth freshener. To add a bit of color, we planted different-colored pansies and an ornamental cabbage.

Hope you all can visit our garden and see how hard work pays off.





eSchoolPLUS Family App



Parents/Guardians,

The St. Johns County School District (SJCSD) has recently implemented the eSchoolPLUS Family Mobile App for parents/guardians. This mobile app allows parents to see many of the Home Access Center (HAC) features from their mobile phone. This application uses the same login credentials as Home Access Center (HAC).

Here is what the eSchoolPlus Family app looks like in the app store (Apple or Google):



Here are some of the key academic areas displayed by this mobile app:

- Student grades
- Attendance
- Assignments
- Report Card and Progress Reports
- Schedule
- Transportation
- Notifications

In addition, we discovered that some parents were using other untrusted 3rd party mobile apps to provide similar data pulled from our system by providing them with their personal HAC credentials. This can be dangerous because, the District has no connection or affiliation with these other vendor apps. By providing them with your credentials, you have granted them access to your child's personal academic data. If this is the case, we recommend you remove the 3rd party app from your phone and then change your password in HAC. Then download and use the new eSchoolPLUS Family app (shown above).

Fundamental Skill Development Stations

Small Group Skill stations are our primary focus of the camp. We approach fundamental skill development with passion and enthusiasm! Coaches will teach the campers that game speed repetition and attention to detail is the key to improving skills. Our stations include a variety of passing, shooting, ball handling, defensive drills. Kindergarten and new students register early!

Voluntary Pre-K: A child must be four years old on or before September 1st.

Kindergarten: A child must be five years old on or before September 1st.

First Grade: A child must be six years old on or before September 1st AND satisfy one of the following:

- a) Satisfactory completion of kindergarten in a Florida public school.
- b) Satisfactory completion of kindergarten in a non-public school.
- c) Previous attendance in an out-of-state school in which the student was admitted on the basis of age requirements established by the state of residency.

Registration Requirements:

- · Proof of Residency.
- · Proof of Immunization.
- Copy of Birth Certificate.
- Physical/Health Exam with in 12 months of enrollment.
